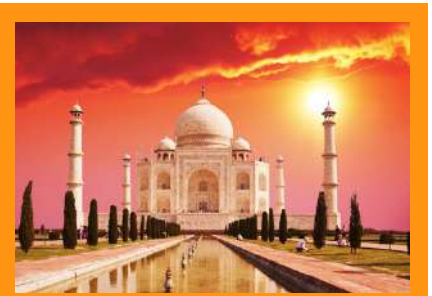

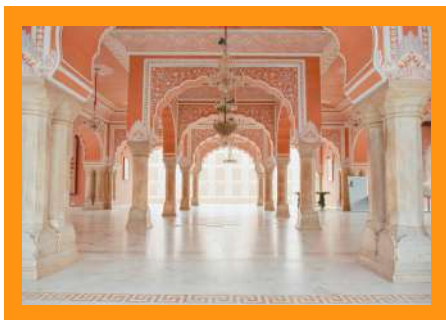

PINK CITY OF JAIPUR (INDIA)

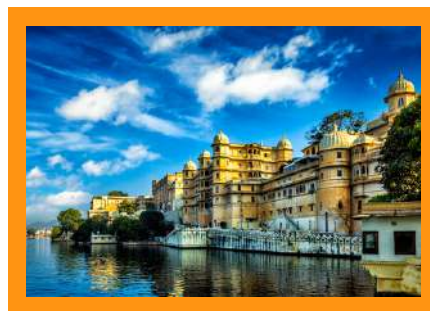

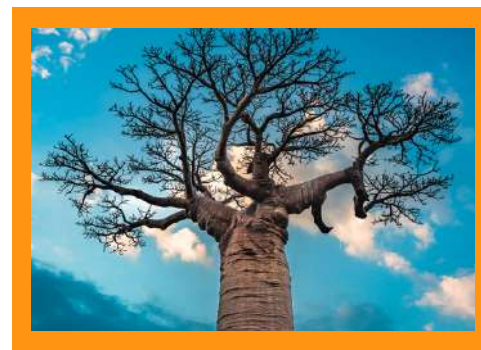
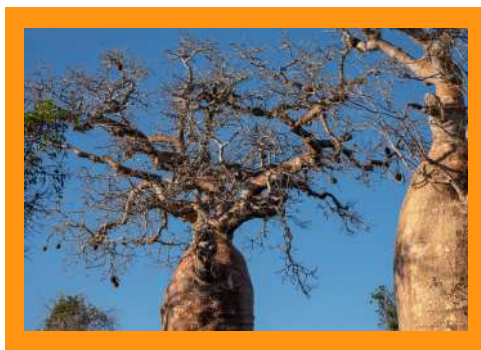


JERUSALEM

THE AVENUE OF THE BAOBOBS IN MADAGASCAR

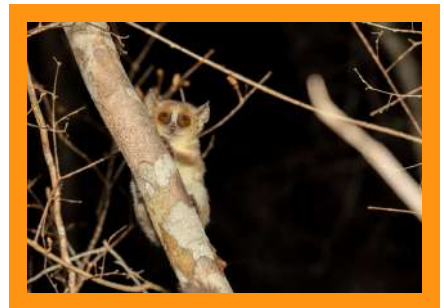
